

Campus Visit

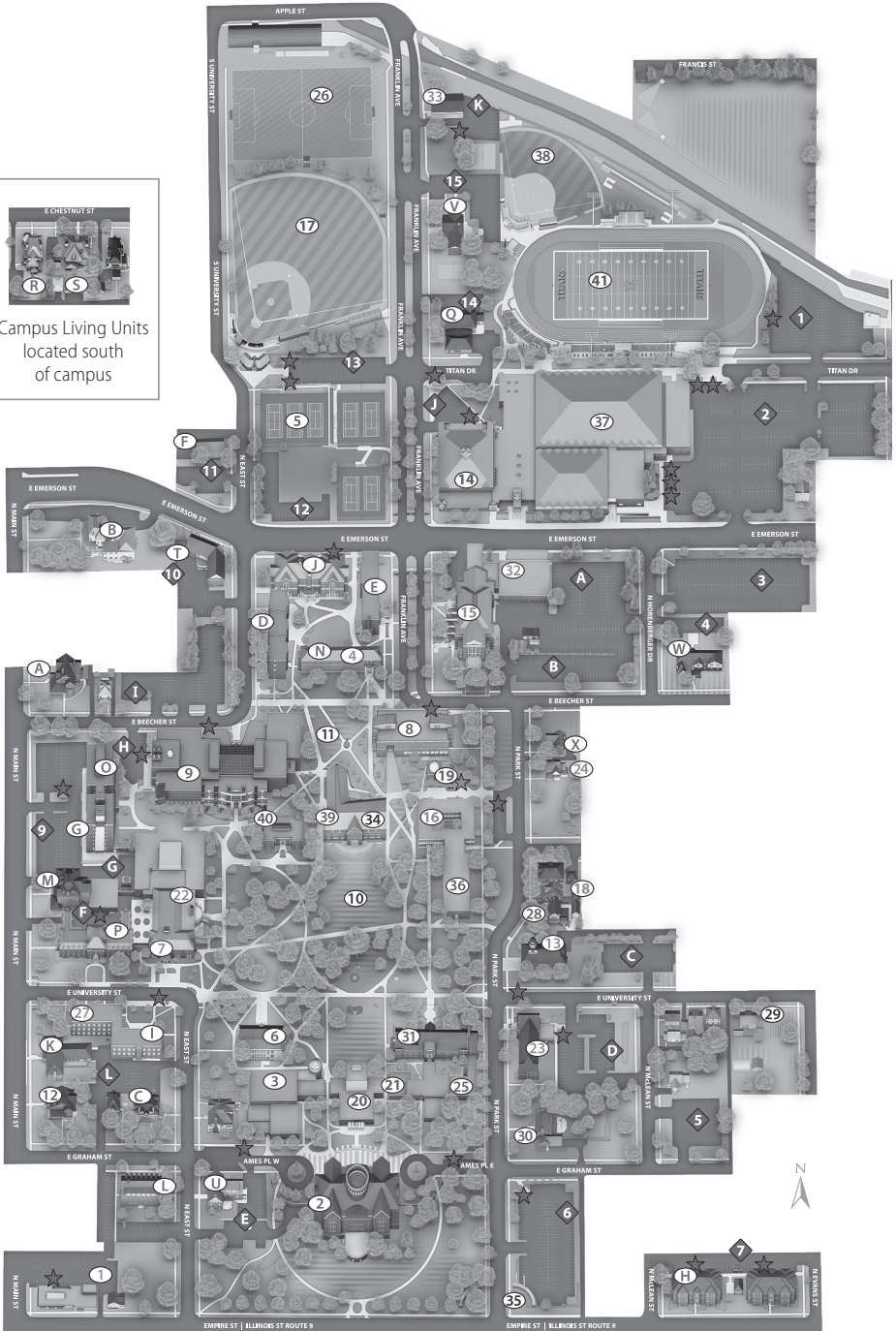
