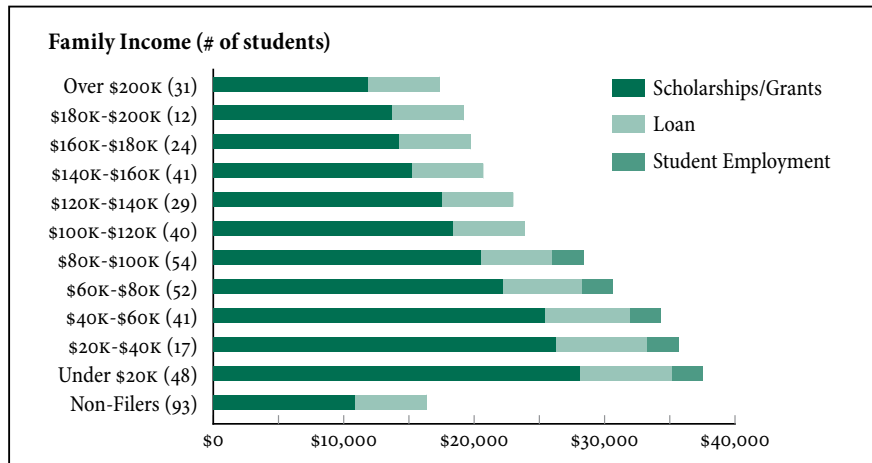

Easy Process

It is free to apply for admission, and the Financial Aid Office will also provide a financial aid proposal for every family at no cost. Students pursuing need-based assistance simply need to submit both the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the Illinois Wesleyan Financial Aid Application. The recommended filing deadline for need-based forms is March 1. Merit scholarships are awarded based on academic information submitted with the application for admission, and talent scholarships are based on audition for students majoring in the fine arts.
