## **12:00pm-Kinsey**

A look at the life of Alfred Kinsey, a pioneer in the area of human sexuality research, whose 1948 publication "Sexual Behavior in the Human Male" was one of the first recorded works that saw science address sexuality.

This film portrays the true story of the murder of Matthew Shepherd, a young gay man growing up on Laramie Wyoming. This brutal killing brought a wave of media attention to hate crimes against gays and lesbians.

## **4:00pm-Transamerica**

Bree is a pre-operative male-to-female transsexual who gets a very unexpected call from a young man in jail who claims to be her son. Bree picks him up from jail and does not explain who she is.

## **6:00pm-The Kids Are All Right**

Lesbian couple Jules and Nic have been together for almost 20 years and have two teenage children who were conceived via artificial insemination. Unbeknown to their mothers, the teens seek out their biological father.
