Beth Crowley (volleyball), Katie Kelly (women's soccer) and Mike Clark (defense-football) Earn College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin "Player of the Week" Honors

Illinois Wesleyan seniors **Beth Crowley** (volleyball) and **Mike Clark** (defense-football) and sophomore **Katie Kelly** (women's soccer) have been selected as "Players of the Week" in their respective sports in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin for the week ending on Sept. 20.

VOLLEYBALL

The Titans won three league matches last week and **Crowley (Normal, West HS)** was instrumental in all of them. She had a total of 52 kills in 11 games (4.70 per game) along with 51 digs (4.6) and 10 blocks (0.9). She recorded 19 kills in a five game victory over Augustana and also had 21 digs. Against Wheaton she put down 18 kills with 20 digs and had 15 kills and 10 digs vs. North Park. It is the second straight week to win the honor for Crowley and the third straight week a Titan has won the CCIW honor (Brette Bower earned the award on Sept. 9). Crowley shared the award with Elmhurst's Lisa Denman, who helped the Bluejays to five straight wins.

WOMEN'S SOCCER

For the second time this season, **Kelly (Wheaton, Wheaton-Warrenville South HS)** has been selected as the CCIW "Player of the Week" after she scored two goals in the Titans' 3-0 victory at Augustana on Sept. 20. Kelly is tied for third in the CCIW with six goals and is tied for fourth with 13 total points.

FOOTBALL

Clark (Joliet, West HS) had eight total tackles and an interception as IWU defeated Washington U., 24-21. Clark had four solos, including one on a third and goal play at the one yard line with 2:10 left in the game and the Titans clinging to a three point lead. Washington U. missed a field goal on the next play. Clark's interception, which he returned 24 yards, came with 58 seconds left to play in the game and cemented the victory. The offensive player of the week was Carthage's Dante Washington, who gained 275 yards rushing and scored three TDs in a 44-14 victory over Benedictine.
