NOTES

Illinois Wesleyan outside hitter **Molly May** was the 2004 "Player of the Year" in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, was chosen to the 12-player all-Midwest region team and was the "MVP" for the 2004 IWU team. May set a school record with 222 blocks and led IWU in kills and hitting percentage last fall. After three seasons she has 504 blocks, leaving her No. 2 all-time at Illinois Wesleyan and within reach of LeAnn Genzel's career mark of 589, set from 1995-98

First Team All-Conference: Molly May, outside hitter; May was fourth in the league with 1.38 blocks per game and eighth with 3.12 kills per game. Her .307 hitting percentage was fifth best in the conference.

Second Team All-Conference: Jenna Passananti, setter; Passananti was fourth in the conference in set assists with 10.81 per game and was tenth in the CCIW with .38 service aces per game.

Third Team All-Conference: Nicole Walsh, middle hitter; Walsh was third in the league with 1.79 blocks per game and was seventh in conference play with 3.14 kills per game.
