- At Illinois Wesleyan, PETH (Physical Education Theory) courses are offered every other year. Please work with your IWU academic advisor to plan your coursework accordingly.
- Choose 1 (U) US Diversity and 1 (G) Global Diversity course to meet IWU graduation requirements. **US Diversity options**: Film 211, HIST 135, HIST 136, MUSI 260, POS 101, or SOC 110. **Global Diversity options**: ANTH 101, HIST 150, MUSI 160, POS 151, RELI 215, SPAN 202
- AP scores of 3, 4, or 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Higher level IB scores of 4 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- The IWU Second Language requirement can be met by completing the intermediate level (XXX-103) course of any language or by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. Visit the IWU website https://www.iwu.edu/languages/ for a list of languages taught.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, the remedial course will not transfer to IWU. Adjust course schedule accordingly to complete degree.
- Students should complete a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or PE courses, at HCC to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of 4 years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level (300/400) courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours) 12/2023
