For over a decade, Illinois Wesleyan University has attempted to be at or above the 80th percentile in faculty salaries among AAUP Category IIB colleges (see below for definition). The University competes, however, with all leading public and private colleges for faculty, and the national average compensation for faculty at the rank of full professor in 2003-04 was \$111,096.

\*IWU corrected its AAUP reporting method in 2003-04 to omit faculty salary stipends for part-time administrative duties such as those of department or program head that had erroneously been included in past reports. Because this correction is not retroactive, these charts give the appearance that IWU faculty at the two highest ranks were actually paid less, on average, in 2003-04 than in 2002-03. Actual salaries paid (regular salary plus salary stipends for administrative work) did not decrease. Even with the correction, IWU remains above the 80th percentile in 2003-04 for the two highest ranks and has closed the salary gap a bit at the assistant rank, where the correction to exclude supplemental salary stipends was not a factor.
