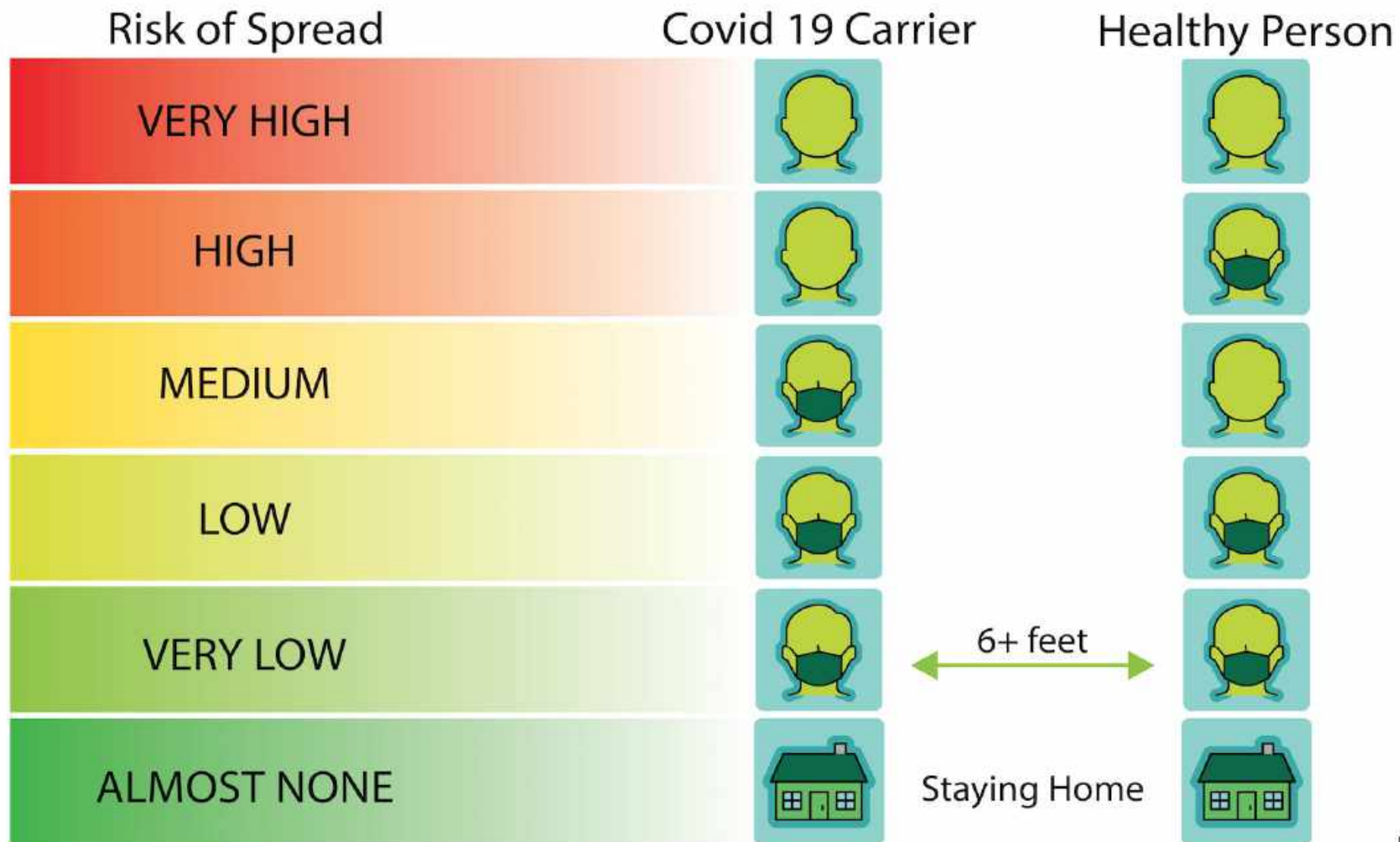

COMMITMENT TO STUDENT AND EMPLOYEE SAFETY

- Monitoring guidelines: IDPH, CDC, McLean County HD
- Masks
- Physical distancing - 6 feet where possible
- Hand washing/sanitizing
- Symptom screening
- Contact tracing
- Student PCR testing upon return

MASKS HELP REDUCE THE SPREAD OF COVID 19



CLEANING PROTOCOLS

- Clean and disinfect restrooms, classrooms and high touch areas each morning
- “Porters” - disinfect 2 additional times per day
- Disinfectant wipes and hand sanitizer provided
- EPA certified disinfectants
- New cleaning equipment including electrostatic sprayers for effective disinfection
- Plexiglass barriers

TRAVEL

- CDC - “Follow state and local travel guidelines” [CDC Travel](#)
- IDPH - “Depending on your travel history, you will be asked to stay home for a period of 14 days from the time you left an area with widespread or ongoing community spread (Level 3 Travel Health Notice)” [IDPH Travel Guidance](#)
- Domestic travel ≠ Level 3

TRAVEL RISK MITIGATION

- Avoid “high interaction” without a mask: < 6 feet for ≥ 15 minutes, especially in “hot spots”
- Wear a mask to keep nose and mouth covered
- Monitor state, local, and territorial government recommendations and requirements
- Wash hands/use sanitizer often
- Self-monitor for symptoms

EMPLOYEE Expectations

- Employee Testing - Encouraged, not required
- Titan Pledge
- Available at Interstate Center
 - Covered by BCBS
 - State will cover the cost for those without insurance

SURVEILLANCE TESTING - EMPLOYEES

- Employees who choose to test without an exposure incident
- May report to work while waiting for result, if asymptomatic
- Surveillance testing & medical procedure

COVID IN OUR COMMUNITY

- Privacy
- Confirmed case = contact tracing by McLean County HD
- CDC guidelines for "community exposure" (exposure outside of health care situation)
 - < 6 feet for ≥ 15 minutes to someone COVID positive

WHAT IF I'VE BEEN EXPOSED TO COVID-19?

- Consult with your healthcare provider
- Stay home until 14 days after last exposure
 - If you are asymptomatic, discuss with your supervisor and/or HR whether telecommuting is an option.
 - Access to accrued sick/personal/vacation time
- Social distance (at least 6 feet) from others at all times
- Self-monitor for symptoms

WHAT IF I TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19?

- Inform your supervisor and Human Resources
- If you are symptomatic - stay home and get well!
- If you are asymptomatic - stay home; discuss with your supervisor and/or HR whether telecommuting is an option.
- Return Guidelines
 - Negative test required

IF A STUDENT GETS COVID

- ▶ Will be expected to go home, if reasonable to do so (travel, vulnerable people at home).
- ▶ If unable to go home, a quarantine space and appropriate support will be provided to students living in university-provided housing.
- ▶ For off-campus students (sororities and apartments/houses), students will need to quarantine at their home or chapter-provided housing.
- ▶ Faculty will be notified of class absence, similar to any illness notification.
- ▶ Contact tracing for other notifications will be coordinated with support from McLean County Health Department.
